Reay's Ranch Investors, Tucson Regional Clean Cities, the town of Sahuarita and Greecycle team up to open the newest E85 site in Arizona and offer grease recycling during the event.

The newest Super Stop, now open in Sahuarita, offers E85 to a growing number of flexible fuel vehicle owners who wish to fuel with the cleaner burning, domestically produced fuel.

Reay's Ranch Investors opened their second E85 site in Arizona and will celebrate with a grand opening on Jan. 26 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. The town of Sahuarita, Tucson Regional Clean Cities Coalition and Greecycle will be on hand to educate the public on the benefits of E85 and biodiesel, and to host the first annual grease recycling event in Sahuarita. Bring your used cooking oil by the site and Greecycle will collect the grease to make biodiesel fuel.

The site at 795 W. Via Rancho Sahuarita will offer E85 for \$1.85 during this four-hour period, along with a free car wash for all E85 customers and fountain drinks for .59 cents (excluding frozen drinks).

"Offering E85 in southern Arizona is just one more way we can ensure flex fuel vehicles are fueling with a domestically produced fuel," said Pima Association of Governments' Clean Cities Manager Colleen Crowninshield. "It's good for our community to have options for cleaner burning domestically produced fuel, and it offers a fueling choice for our visitors from across the border as well.

"Besides its superior performance characteristics, ethanol burns cleaner than gasoline," she said. "It is a completely renewable, domestic, environmentally friendly fuel that enhances the nation's economy and energy security."

Southern Arizona leads the state in accessible E85 stations open for public use.
