**PAG participates in Clean Air Days with Green Commute Fair**

Are gas prices getting to you? Are you concerned about our air quality? If you answered yes to either of these questions, you should attend Pima Association of Governments' Green Commute Fair on Thursday, April 3.

The Green Commute Fair is part of a month-long celebration in April of the annual Clean Air Days and Bike Fest. Learn more about carpooling, downtown parking, clean fuel vehicles, environmental quality, and other transportation alternatives.

The Green Commute Fair is a new event and will be held from 10:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. in Jacome Plaza next to the Main Library downtown near Stone and Alameda.

The April 3 event will include a variety of exhibitors, free materials, a display of clean fuel vehicles and more. The fair is sponsored by PAG, VPSI, Canyon Ranch, Fry's and Albertson's.

The Green Commute Fair will include a Clean Air Auto Show, featuring an array of vehicles that use many types of fuel including ethanol, biodiesel, straight vegetable oil (SVO), compressed natural gas (CNG) and electricity.

Highlights will be a 14-passenger VPSI commuter van, a ZAP electric car and the city of Tucson's first flexible-fuel patrol car – a 2008 Crown Victoria. A city dump truck and a Honda Civic, provided by Clean Energy, both run on CNG and will be on display. Sun Tran will display a bus that runs on B20. Sun Tran's fleet now runs 100 percent on cleaner burning fuels, either biodiesel or compressed natural gas. Individuals who use alternative fuel sources will show the electric ZAP car along with a pickup that runs on vegetable oil.

The Clean Air Days and Bike Fest events kick off with a Bike Movie Fest at the Fox Theatre on March 30 and continue through the end of April with the Tucson Earth Day Festival and Parade on April 19 at Reid Park. Additional events are scheduled in between including a brown bag lunch series on "Bringing Earth Day Home" at the downtown library.

Clean Air Days event sponsors include the City of Tucson, Pima County Department of Transportation, Pima Association of Governments, Pima County Department of Environmental Quality, Sun Tran, Pima Community College, the University of Arizona, the Governor's Office of Highway Safety, Southwest Gas and Bookman's.
