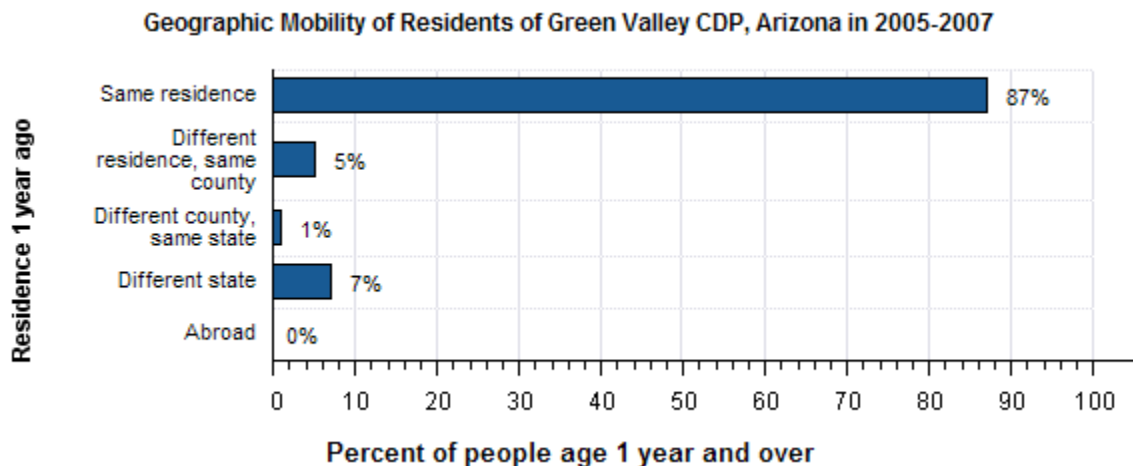

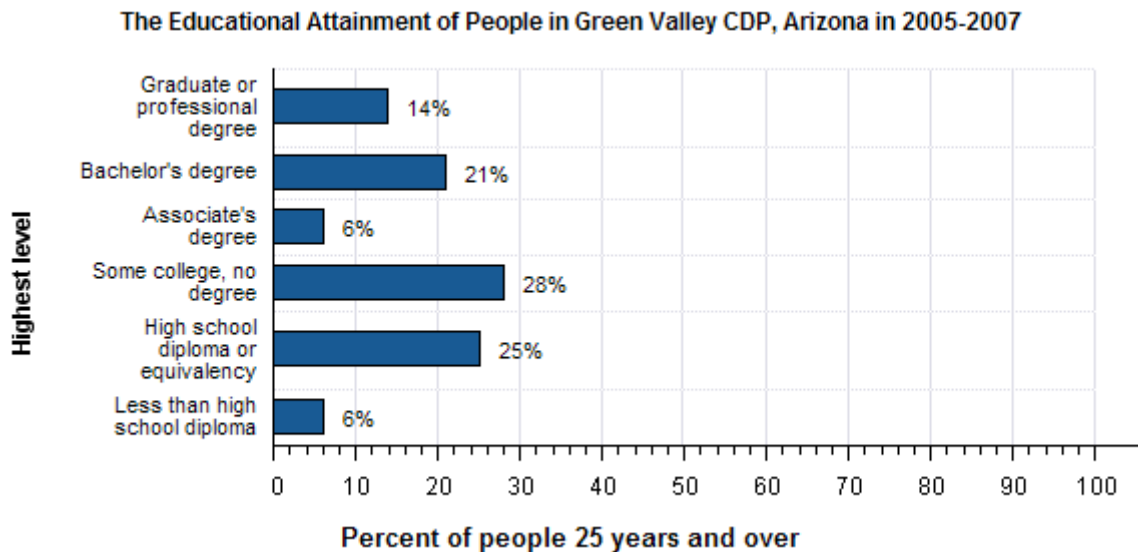
NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Data for this section cannot be displayed because the number of sample cases is too small. Displaying the data would risk disclosing information for individuals.

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: From 2005-2007, 87 percent of the people at least one year old living in Green Valley were living in the same residence one year earlier; 5 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 1 percent from another county in the same state, 7 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.



EDUCATION: From 2005-2007, 94 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 35 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Six percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Green Valley was 730 from 2005-2007. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 66 and elementary or high school enrollment was 340 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 320.



DISABILITY: In Green Valley, among people at least five years old from 2005-2007, 28 percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from less than 0.5 percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to 20 percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to 31 percent of those 65 and older.

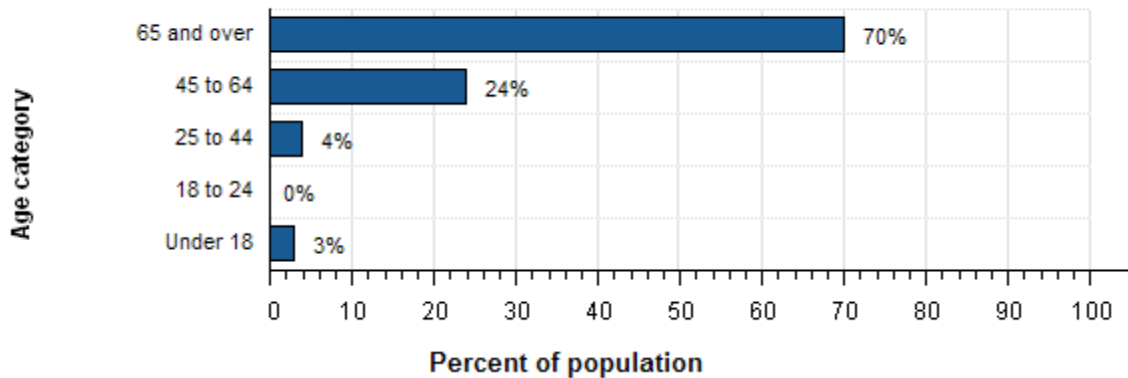

INCOME: The median income of households in Green Valley was \$43,567. Twenty-seven percent of the households received earnings and 54 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Eighty-two percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$16,866. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POPULATION: From 2005-2007, Green Valley had a total population of 21,000 - 12,000 (57 percent) females and 9,200 (43 percent) males. The median age was 71.1 years. Three percent of the population was under 18 years and 70 percent was 65 years and older.

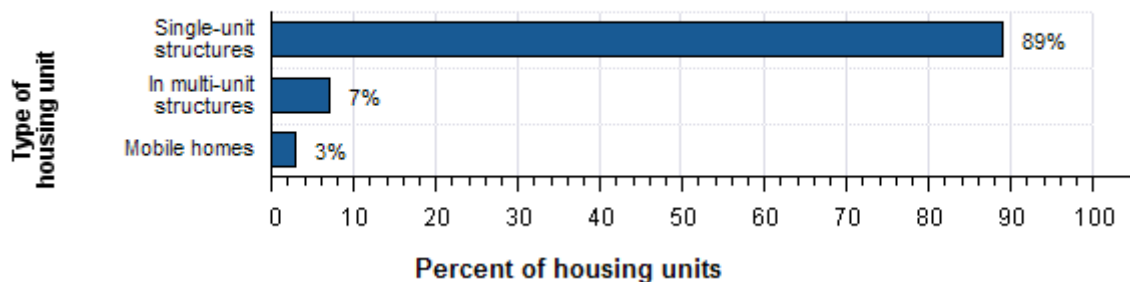
The Age Distribution of People in Green Valley CDP, Arizona in 2005-2007



For people reporting one race alone, 98 percent were White; less than 0.5 percent were Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent were American Indian and Alaska Native; 1 percent were Asian; less than 0.5 percent were Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and less than 0.5 percent were of some other race. One percent reported being of two or more races. Four percent of the people in Green Valley were Hispanic. Ninety-four percent of the people in Green Valley were White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: From 2005-2007, Green Valley had a total of 17,000 housing units, 23 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 89 percent were in single-unit structures, 7 percent were in multi-unit structures, and 3 percent were mobile homes. Thirty-seven percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: From 2005-2007, Green Valley had 13,000 occupied housing units - 11,000 (86 percent) owner occupied and 1,800 (14 percent) renter occupied. Less than 0.5 percent of the households did not have telephone service and 4 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Thirty-three percent had two vehicles and another 2 percent had three or more.
