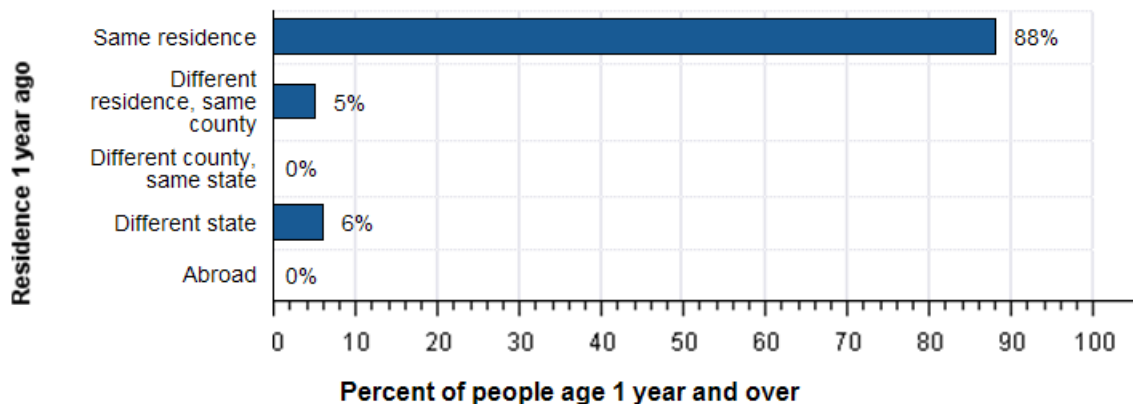

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: From 2006-2008, 88 percent of the people at least one year old living in Green Valley were living in the same residence one year earlier; 5 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, less than 0.5 percent from another county in the same state, 6 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.

Geographic Mobility of Residents of Green Valley CDP, Arizona in 2006-2008

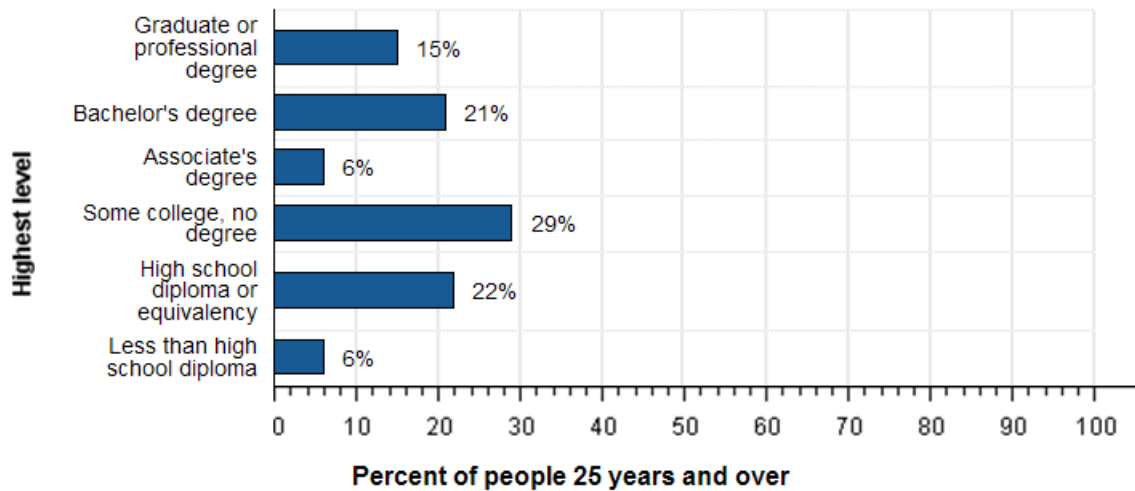

EDUCATION: From 2006-2008, 94 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 36 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Six percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Green Valley was 740 in 2006-2008. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 57 and elementary or high school enrollment was 320 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 370.

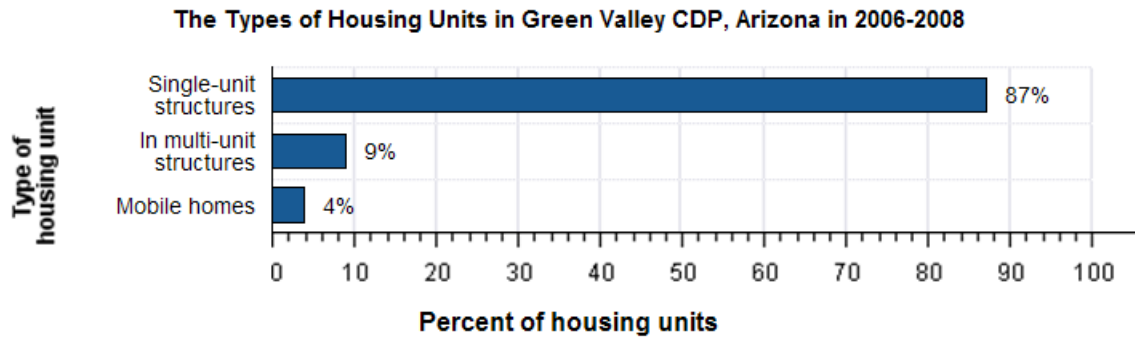

INCOME: The median income of households in Green Valley was \$44,799. Twenty-eight percent of the households received earnings and 52 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Eighty-four percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$17,397. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

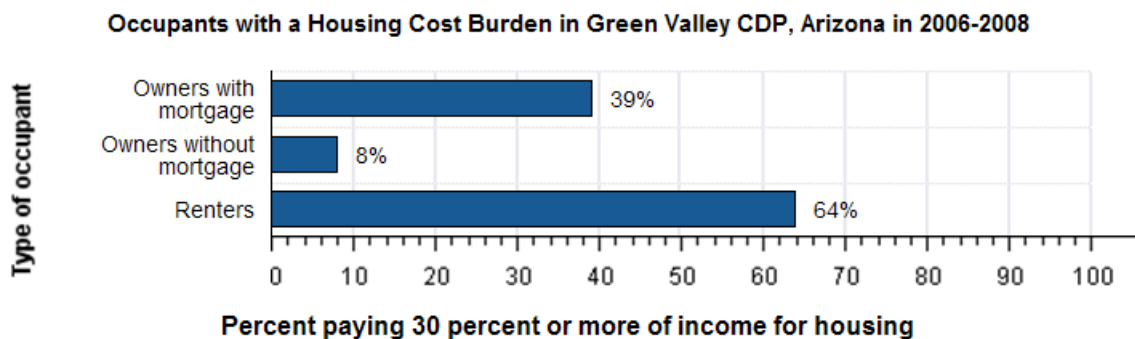
HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: From 2006-2008, Green Valley had a total of 16,000 housing units, 24 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 87 percent were in single-unit structures, 9 percent were in multi-unit structures, and 4 percent were mobile homes. Thirty-seven percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: From 2006-2008, Green Valley had 12,000 occupied housing units - 11,000 (86 percent) owner occupied and 1,700 (14 percent) renter occupied. Less than 0.5 percent of the households did not have telephone service and 6 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Thirty-one percent had two vehicles and another 2 percent had three or more.

HOUSING COSTS: The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$988, nonmortgaged owners \$292, and renters \$824. Thirty-nine percent of owners with mortgages, 8 percent of owners without mortgages, and 64 percent of renters in Green Valley spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.
